#### July / August 2023



On the 12<sup>th</sup> of June, I celebrated 29 years as an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ. Actually, I didn't celebrate it... Monday June 12, 2023 just came and went like most of the rest of the days of my life; maybe your life is like that too. The days seem to roll by without major events or insights to separate one from the next. But when I sat down to write this page, it dawned on me that I have been an ordained minister exactly half of my life, for I am currently

Although it happened so many years ago, I still remember parts of my ecclesiastical council. The ecclesiastical council is the last step before ordination; it is an oral exam, in which pastors and church folks ask questions of the candidate. The pastor of the church through which I was ordained—First Congregational UCC in Watertown, WI—was Bob Tully, and he was newly retired at the time of my ecclesiastical council, but he was there for support and encouragement. I remember him saying something to the affect of "I don't know if I would be able to cope with all of the issues that new ministers face from the very beginning in this day and age."

He mentioned things like ministering to people with AIDS and reaching out to families that seemed to be too busy to worship on Sunday mornings. First Congregational UCC had just been rebuilt on a new site when I had my council and then my ordination. "We have a brand-new building," Bob seemed to be saying. "How are future generations of ministers and church folks going to gather in this space and fill it?"

Well, I have ministered to a few people with AIDS in my years of ministry, including my first boyfriend from high school, whose funeral I officiated in 1997 when he was only 30 years old. At that time, AIDS was still a death sentence; now people lead mostly normal lives while treating the virus with medication therapy. What neither Bob nor I saw coming was the perfect storm of COVID 19, The Opioid Epidemic, Surging Increases in Mental Illness (which were only made worse by the isolation of COVID and a lack of counselors), a consistent rise in Mass Shootings, Racial Violence, and Hyper-partisanship. During COVID our church buildings were not filled at all, and most churches—and service organizations and clubs—are finding people returning more slowly than expected.

In his farewell address, our first president—George Washington—proclaimed that our democracy would not survive if we forgot that we were dependent on each other for all of us to live out the ideals of our constitution. We need connection to each other now more than ever before; we need connection to God most of all. May we celebrate our freedom this year by realizing that we are bound together. After all, the motto of the United Church of Christ is "that they may all be one."


