I suppose I should warn you; this is going to be a "Cat's in The Cradle" December newsletter article. Do you remember the song Cat's in the Cradle? It is the Harry Chapin song about a young father who is too busy with his work commitments to spend much time with his son. At the end of the song, the father has inadvertently taught his now adult

son the wrong lesson...for his son is now too busy to catch up with dear old dad. The father finally has found the time to enjoy his son's company, but the son has carried his father's example of distance and distraction into his own adult scheduling. In the first few verses, the son is idolizing his dad and saying: "I'm going to be like him." In the last verse, the father has been talking to his son on the phone—briefly—and he concludes: "And as I hung up the phone, it occurred to me, he'd grown up just like me...my boy was just like me."

I was talking with a friend the other day, and we were reminiscing about Christmas presents that we had gotten in the past. I remember my first Easy Bake Oven and my first Lite Brite. I also remember numerous record albums and calendars, and in 1976 I received a Bicentennial alarm clock that was red, white, and blue. It woke me up for school a great many years before it finally quit working.

More important than the gifts that have appeared under the tree or in the stockings though, were the gifts of time. I have vivid memories of finding the perfect tree at the Christmas Tree Farm on the Friday after Thanksgiving. After my oldest brother Jeff died in 1986, we started a new family tradition that year of cutting Christmas trees. Chili and Thanksgiving leftovers were waiting for us for lunch when we got back to mom and dad's house.

Howie had spent many a Christmas alone after his mother died. When we were married, I always set up my mother's ceramic village on our fireplace mantle. We spent many nights after he came home from work with just the village lights shining. It became a reassurance for him that he could replace some of those lonely yuletides with more precious ones.

My friend Linda and I used to bake dozens upon dozens of Christmas cookies for our families for many Christmases. It was a tradition of time spent that she shared with her nieces after they were old enough to join in. What I am trying to help you remember is that time together is the greatest gift...may you be truly gifted this holiday season. Have the most blessed Christmas yet.


Here is one way our church can benefit from your holiday giving:
