

You have more than likely encountered this Celtic Blessing before. It is a simple yet eloquent expression of providence, protection, and productivity. The word "may" as it is used here, is classified as a modal verb. According to the Cambridge Dictionary it has several meanings: it can be used to express possibility; it can be used to ask or give permission; it can be used to introduce a wish or a hope. The word May can also be a proper noun. As a proper noun, it is the 5th month of our calendar.

During this month, let May wear two hats. Let May not only be the month in which you are currently living, but let it also be the possibilities, permissions, wishes. and hopes that surround us and make themselves known to us.

People who spend their time seeing to the mental health of themselves and others are telling us that more people are more anxious and more depressed now than ever before. They believe that there are numerous reasons for these mental health challenges. Raffael Warnock—who is both a senator and a pastor—has observed that we never really stopped to mourn all that we truly lost because of the COVID 19 Pandemic. Over 1 million Americans died of COVID 19. As Warnock rightly observed "That is a lot of empty chairs at the table..." Others are worried about their finances amid fluctuating markets and tariffs. Still others are feeling overwhelmed by personal distractions and downturns in their lives. There is plenty about which to feel anxious and depressed.

But can we allow May to be the time we may be kinder and gentler with ourselves and others? Can we allow May to be the time we may find unity and strength amid diverse attitudes and opinions? Can we allow May to be the time we may dream of a better future...not just for ourselves, but for generations after us whom we will never meet?

May you find what you are needing to find...

May you leave behind what you are needing to leave behind...

May the love of God surround you like the Spring sun and wind and rain...
