The 24th of June is the Feast of St. John. There were many different men named John in the New Testament of the Bible. There was John, the disciple who was one of the three disciples in the inner circle of Jesus (Peter and James, John's brother, were the other two). In the Gospel of John, John is consistently referred to as "the

one whom Jesus loved". I always thought that was egotistical, but it does explain why John is lying against Jesus in Rembrandt's masterpiece "The Last Supper". It is unlikely that the author of I John, II John, and III John is the same author who wrote the Gospel of John, for the letters were written significantly later than the gospel, which was written around 100 CE. There is also John of Patmos, who wrote the last book of the New Testament— Revelation. He is not the religious figure for whom the Feast of St. John is named either.

The Feast of St. John is named for John the Baptist, and unlike other feast days for saints, the Feast of St. John is in honor of the birth of John the Baptist...not his death. (The only other saint whose birthday is honored as a feast day is Mary, the mother of Jesus.)

The 24th of June is also the Summer Solstice, which is the longest day of the entire year. After June 24th, the minutes and hours of daylight will slowly decrease until the Winter Solstice in December. At the start of the ministry of John the Baptist he said of his relationship to Jesus: "He must increase, and I must decrease…" So, nature reminds us that the light of St. John steadily decreases. Because we celebrate the birth of Jesus so promptly after the Winter Solstice, the light of Jesus is increasing steadily after his birth on the 25th.

Before Christianity, Pagans celebrated the Summer Solstice by lighting bonfires. It was believed that evil spirits and witches were more active at the solstice, so bonfires were lit to scare these evil creatures away. Christian tradition continues to honor the Feast of St. John with bonfires; their bonfires are in honor of St. John the Baptist being the light that bore witness to the "One True Light" Jesus Christ.

I am hoping that it is not raining on the 24th of this month, for I intend to light a fire in the fire pit of my back yard, reminding myself to bear witness to the "One True Light" just like John the Baptist did. There may even be s'mores involved…one never knows!
